Parks Canada National Historic Sites

- L'Anse aux Meadows.** A UNESCO World Heritage Site & only authenticated European (Norse) settlement in North America. Try blacksmithing, woodworking, weaving, or The Test of Tykir, Escape Room. Route 436, L'Anse aux Meadows; (709) 623-2608; pc.gc.ca/lanseauxmeadows
- Port au Choix.** Crossroads of 6000 years of human history; four ancient cultures; limestone barrens; archaeology. Point Riche Rd, Port au Choix; (709) 861-3522; pc.gc.ca/portauchaix

Captivating Treks

- Bird Cove Trails: Big Droke and Dog Peninsula.** Explore trails & shoreline where prehistoric peoples once thrived, Bird Cove, 50centuries.ca
- Fishing Point.** Municipal Park trailhead for 4 trails all with exhilarating ocean views, potential to view icebergs & whales. St. Anthony; stanthonyc.a
- International Appalachian Trails:**
 - French Shore Trail.** Follow the eastern coastline between two historic communities; Route 434, Conche; 13 km; 2 days; and
 - Indian Lookout Trail.** Summit 640m for sweeping panoramic coastal views. Five Mile Road, Route 430; 40 km; 3-4 days; Backcountry experience or guide recommended; iatn.org
- John Hogan Trail.** Meander the Torrent River, Hawke's Bay; 3 km boardwalk; Easy
- Marjorie Bridge & Thrombolites Walking Trail.** Fossil record of the earth's most primitive life forms. Route 430, Flower's Cove; Easy; townofflowerscove.com
- North East Way:**
 - Barr'd Island Trail.** Coastal views of the quaint fishing community. Route 433, Englee; 0.5 km loop;
 - Glass Hole Trail.** Geology, history, & coastal lookouts. Route 434, Conche; 6.8 km return; and
 - Underground Salmon Pool.** Only place in the world where salmon travel underground to complete their migration. Route 433; 1.9 km loop.

- French Rooms Cultural Centre & Bread Oven Experience.** Learn about the French fishermen and resettlement. At the reconstructed French bread oven try freshly baked bread with local jams and molasses. - Grenfell Historic Properties.** Discover why Sir Wilfred Grenfell is a heroic medical missionary through extraordinary stories of hardship during the early 1900s and artifacts from an isolated northern coast. St. Anthony; (709) 454-4010; grenfell-properties.com

- Nurse Bennett Heritage House.** Built in 1922, the traditional 2-storey home of nurse Myra Bennett pays tribute to outpost nursing. Circular Rd, Daniel's Harbour; (709) 632-9389; nursebennett.ca
- Norstead - A Viking Port of Trade.** A living history site with costumed interpreters and the Viking ship Snorri. Route 436, L'Anse aux Meadows; (877) 620-2282; norstead.com

Natural World: Geology, Flora and Fauna
